WSSDA has revised the policy for Student Learning Goals to mirror the verbiage in RCW 28A.150.210 more closely.

• 2108 BP Learning Assistance Program

This policy had not been updated since 2005, and needed substantive revision to reflect not only ESSA, but also changes to Chapter 392-162 WAC. After revising this essential policy to include the necessary information, there was no need to maintain an associated procedure, as that information would be either redundant or superfluous. Consequently, WSSDA has deleted the associated procedure.

 3232 BP/3232 P Parent and Student Rights in Administration of Surveys, Analysis, or Evaluations

These revisions address both clarity and function. The policy sets out the steps districts must take to protect student privacy during the administration of surveys

• 5050 BP Contracts

ESSA does not dictate the standard of qualifications for teachers and paraeducators. Instead, it requires states to establish standards for paraprofessionals working in Title I schools or programs. This is reflected in the policy update.
