#### 8. 7:55 PM POLICY UPDATES

- A. First Reading Policies
  - Policy 2336 Required Observances (Veterans Day, Constitution Day, Temperance and Good Citizenship Day, Disability History Month)

The legislation states that if resources allow, on Temperance and Good Citizenship Day, social studies teachers must coordinate a voter registration event in each history or social studies class attended by high school seniors. The event includes that for all students who will be at least eighteen by the next general election, teachers must make voter registration available in the classroom via both online and paper registration forms and provide adequate time for students to complete the registration process in class. Voter registration will not be required until January 16, 2020, but the WSSDA revised Model Policy and Procedure 2336 – Required Observances to include this information now to help districts prepare for a smooth transition.

- Policy 2413 Equivalency Credit for Career and Technical Education Courses WSSDA has revised this policy based Senate Bill (SB) 6136, which removes the requirement for the student to be concurrently enrolled in or have successfully completed algebra II for AP computer science to be counted as a career and technical equivalent to high school mathematics. SB 6136 becomes effective on June 7, 2018.
- Policy/P 3220 Freedom of Expression WSSDA update.
- Policy 6000 Program Planning, Budget Preparation, Adoption and Implementation
   WSSDA initially revised this policy to reflect the requirement in House Bill (HB) 2242
   that districts develop or update four-year budgets as part of their annual budget
   development process. Additionally, WSSDA identified other portions of the policy,
   specifically in the notice section that required revision to conform to the law.
